BACKGROUND INFORMATION

24: Live Another Day takes place following a catastrophic cyberattack that destroyed London. **At 04:08 GMT**, Protocol Trinity, an undercover digital bypass system, was triggered. **There was a general blackout of the transportation system, emergency services, and electricity grid.** Although there were **no indications of the attacker's identity** or intentions, **the attack appeared to have come from the United Kingdom's (UK) own systems.** Airspaces were shut down, trains stopped with people still on board, and hospitals lost medical records.

UNIT (Unified Network for International Threats) is a global coalition of officials and agencies working together to respond to major international crises and threats. The coalition recently **approved a proposal for a policy known as Mandate Zero.** The temporary policy would give UNIT authority even for a nation's systems during a crisis situation. UNIT would be allowed to close down communications, close down equipment, and put in place measures to stop any more harm from being passed through under the policy. **The scheme also revealed that Protocol Trinity had been secretly developed. This raised the question of what exactly UNIT had been keeping from the public—and even from their own agents.**

Following the attack, individuals stepped up and said they knew what resulted in Protocol Trinity. They identify themselves as government contractors and former government agents. **They are among the individuals wanted for breaking the law for purposes of gathering intelligence as well as stealing information. Even if they prove beneficial, the public is not certain they can trust them.** Meanwhile, there is vociferous condemnation of UNIT. As many as thirty countries are conducting demonstrations against it. Governments are being compelled to account for their behaviour under Protocol Trinity. People are asking now why UNIT has this kind of power and why it is exercised with so little transparency. **By UNIT having this kind of power, questions have been raised about sovereignty at the national level, cybersecurity, and cooperation between countries.**

TOPICS OF DISCUSSION

TOPIC #1: MANDATE ZERO

At 4:08 GMT, an unidentified code activated Protocol Trinity, the nation's last-resort digital override system embedded within the UK's infrastructure. Within minutes, London's power grid, emergency services and transportation systems shut down. Hospitals lost access to confidential medical records. **Air traffic control froze. Automated transit locked citizens, leaving them shocked. Despite this, no demands were issued. No fingerprints were left. No evidence. The breach came from the inside - it had to.**

The chaos exposed more than just a technological flaw. It exposed the dangerous interconnection of all systems in London. A lack of communications technology allowed little to no international communication. **Even if a message got through, it would still be too slow to command a real-time response. In a desperate attempt to control the chaos, UNIT leadership introduced Mandate Zero, a temporary framework to grant centralized authority over international digital operations.** Under this revamped mandate, UNIT would be able to intercept international data, find the root cause and deploy containment measures.

This would have been an unquestioned measure, if the power had been given to all members of Protocol Trinity. An imbalance of power and authority in Protocol Trinity led diplomats and political figures to determine if this was a necessity or just a ploy for power.

The question no one wants to ask aloud: Was Protocol Trinity used to stop a threat... or to test how much control UNIT could take before anyone noticed?

GUIDING QUESTIONS

1. Should **Mandate Zero** be invoked to **centralize crisis response** powers?
2. What **safeguards** can exist within an **emergency system** that **overrides national control**?

TOPIC 2: ASYLUM OR ASSET?

Since the breach in London, a string of people came to the forefront with **alleged vital information about the origin of Protocol Trinity**. They consist of **former intelligence agents, government contractors, and agents outside the circle of UNIT**. They are mostly wanted for different offenses ranging from **unauthorized surveillance, data pilferage**, or even **breaches of international security treaties**. Some say that they **hold knowledge capable of unmasking the party responsible for the breach**. Others say that they are **driven by vested interests**.

Their lives have been contentious. Certain individuals believe their evidence could **expose corruption, avert future disasters, and bring the right people to justice**. Others find them **threatening and unreliable**, and feel that **protecting them will discredit UNIT and encourage people to disregard the law**. A few countries already **provide protection to informants**, while others **order their arrest and extradition**. They bring us difficult questions of **justice, trust, and accountability**. If what they say is true, **ignoring them could be a serious mistake**. But if they are untruthful, **believing them will do irreparable harm**.

In a time where **truth is in doubt and trust is lost**, the issue is: **Will UNIT listen to what the rule-breakers say—or ignore them and perhaps never discover what they knew?**

GUIDING QUESTIONS

1. **Should individuals with a history of illegal activity be allowed to provide evidence in a high-level investigation?**
2. Does protecting informants set a dangerous precedent, or is it necessary to **uncover the truth?**
3. **Who should decide whether an informant is credible—individual member states or UNIT as a whole?**
4. **Can UNIT maintain its legitimacy if it relies on people who were once considered threats to international security?**

TOPIC 3: UNIT'S CRISIS OF LEGITIMACY

Since the beginning of Protocol Trinity, UNIT has come under mounting pressure—both from the government but also from the public at large. Leaked documents, conflicting statements, and mounting distrust triggered demonstrations across various cities. **People allege that UNIT is conducting operations with too much confidentiality, too little transparency, and too little accountability to the people they are meant to protect.**

There is now pressure on some nations to pull out of UNIT or to suspend the cooperation entirely. Others are being urged to reveal their involvement in the breach and to explain what role they played in the development of the Trinity Protocol. **As the committee carries on with internal discussions, the world waits — and grows impatient.**

UNIT's issue is now no longer a matter of correcting systems or determining accountability. Its main concern is proving to the international community that the organization still has a legitimate reason to exist.

In this time period of accountability, will UNIT survive against the backdrop of a decline in public trust — has the decay come too far? And if public opinion keeps spiraling downward, must nations reconsider their association, or hold fast with the group hoping for stability to be regained?

GUIDING QUESTIONS

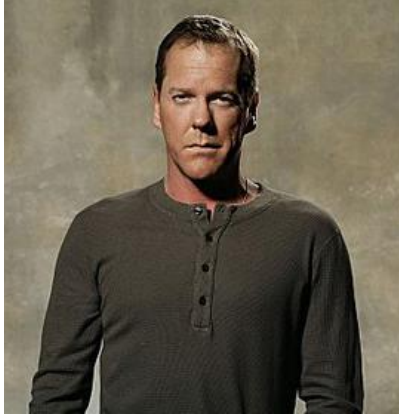
1. **Should UNIT increase transparency to rebuild public trust, even if it risks exposing sensitive information?**

3. What role should the media and civil society play in international crisis response?
4. **Can UNIT function as an effective organization if its legitimacy is publicly**

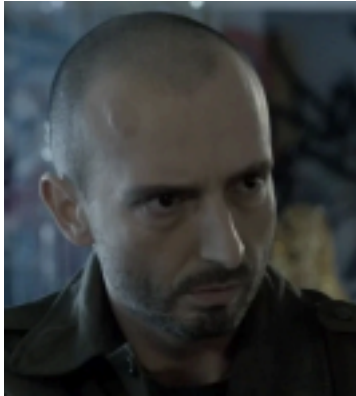
Margot Al-Harazi

Accomplice to Simone, Ian is also waiting for the right time to strike, although is starting to lose his patience.</p>
<p>Anatol Stolnavich</p> 	<p>Anatol Stolnavich, a high ranking and influential Russian diplomat operating within the intricate sphere of international politics, frequently conducts internal affairs that are carefully concealed, providing high-stake agendas, even ones that cannot be disclosed. His ties to clandestine activities remain hidden beneath the deep surface of a formal diplomat who handles operations between powerful nations. Formal and put-together for the public, tensed and irritated in private, working based off of unspoken motivations that drive his often unpredictable actions on the global stage, all whilst concealing his alter-ego.</p>

Belcheck



Belcheck is a highly skilled and well known operative within the organization led by Adrian Cross. Despite being part of a secretive organization, **the operations he conducts remains a mystery, even to his colleagues.** His **colleagues view him as a somewhat mysterious figure whose personal life, motivations and allegiances are still vague.** **People do know that Belcheck possesses a vast variety of practical skills and consistently demonstrates readiness in order to efficiently complete any task at hand with little to no hesitation and complete disregard for morality or ethics.**

He **represents the military's professionalism and strict order, providing military advice in moments of extended tensions.** **Coburn is a rigid protocol follower and will not go against any bills or laws.** He has no doubt about **following the chain of command and does not go any other way.** This attitude frequently results in a head-on clash with the practices of other members in the bureau. **To Coburn, reckless methods used are uncompromising to the point of putting national security in jeopardy.**
