BACKGROUND INFORMATION

In the world of *A Series of Unfortunate Events*, where misfortune, mystery, and an abundance of secrets prevail, the line between good and evil is becoming increasingly difficult to differentiate, as self-interest begins to cloud everyone's better judgment. Once, the secret organization, Volunteer Fire Department, commonly referred to as V.F.D., had one primary mission: to bring good to the world by preserving the truth. The organization was focused on putting out both literal and metaphorical fires to extinguish cruelty, ignorance, and injustice. Over time, V.F.D. fractured into two factions by a dangerous schism: the Fire-Fighting and Fire-Starting Sides. One continues the legacy of the original organization, while the other utilizes more harmful tactics to start fires for their own selfish motives. In the end, only one thing is true: the two split schisms have put V.F.D. on the very brink of collapse, and it is up to you to reunite it.

Amid the rising chaos of V.F.D's collapse, the extravagant Baudelaire mansion becomes nothing more than a pile of ash. The children of the late Baudelaires, notorious for their secrecy and wealth—Violet, Klaus, and Sunny—have narrowly escaped with their lives. The orphaned children are thrust into a devious game of guardianship and greed, as others hope to gain their custody for a chance at the massive Baudelaire fortune left behind. The prime suspect? Count Olaf, a villain with theatrical talents and a notorious unibrow who will go to any length necessary to get his hands on their family fortune. Complicating matters further, the infamous Sugar Bowl has mysteriously gone missing, causing panic among members of the Volunteer Fire Department as rumours of a thief run wild. Not only does this artifact contain hidden secrets and a life-saving antidote for a deadly fungus, but it serves as a symbol of the dangerous knowledge and power that drove V.F.D. apart. Now, with the once-honourable organization in ruin, you, delegate, have been entrusted to reunite V.F.D., find guardianship for the Baudelaire orphans, uncover the truth behind the missing Sugar Bowl, and restore the foundations of the Volunteer Fire Department to ensure past mistakes never repeat themselves.

TOPICS OF DISCUSSION

TOPIC #1: THE FATE OF THE BAUDELAIRES

The Baudelaire Fortune, the emblem of both inheritance and tragedy, is more than a mere sum of money. It is a symbol of legacy, power, and ultimate moral choices. A sum so grand, in hands so little. Although it may technically belong to Violet, Klaus, and Sunny Baudelaire, all are within reach of such a fortune and some will stop at nothing to get it. The inheritance itself is held in trust by Mr. Poe's bank, Mulctuary Money Management, and is meant to be given to the children once Violet turns 18 years old. However, that is still a time away. For the time being, it is crucial that the Baudelaire orphans are cared for by proper hands in order to tend to their well-being and careful upbringing. With guardianship of the Baudelaires, one may have direct access to the fortune that is destined for the children.

This brings up the ultimate question—who is best fit to take care of Violet, Klaus, and Sunny Baudelaire? In whose hands does the fate of these tragic orphans lie? Further complicating matters, the siblings themselves cannot agree upon a common guardian, causing tensions to arise amongst them. It is important to note that the chosen candidate must be able to provide the best possible life for these children and to not do so out of greed for what comes with them. The issue is pressing, for if a fit guardian is not decided in time, the entire Baudelaire fortune risks getting liquidated as the eldest Violet will not be of age in time to claim it. A sum more than enough to sustain seven lifetimes, will risk being lost forever with no one to claim it. It is vital that the money does not fall into the wrong hands, for misuse of the Baudelaire fortune may cause disastrous consequences and endanger the lives of everyone in V.F.D.

GUIDING QUESTIONS

- 1. Who is the best fit for taking care of the Baudelaire children? What criteria or strategies will you use to uncover the most suitable person for this great responsibility?
- 2. What should be done with the massive Baudelaire fortune? How can it be safeguarded?
- 3. What can be done to ensure the Baudelaires are safe, without repeating past mistakes?

4. Should they be granted independence after enduring so much, or should they be entrusted to an adult to care for their upbringing?



TOPIC #2: THE STOLEN SUGAR BOWL

The Sugar Bowl: it may appear to be a simple kitchen item used for tea parties. In reality, the sugar bowl is a legendary souvenir craved by both sides of the V.F.D. organization. Originally, this seemingly strange artifact was stolen from Hotel Denouement, where it was in the original possession of the renowned hotel manager, Dewey Denouement. This mysterious artifact may not seem all that important; however, there must be a significant reason why it has torn allies into enemies, left destruction in its wake, and has recently been stolen. The thief hides in plain sight, among these very seats.

Thus far, the details known regarding the Sugar Bowl are scarce. Generally, it is widely believed that within the Sugar Bowl lies a cure to the Medusoid Mycelium, a deadly fungus whose fumes, if inhaled, can kill within the hour. With threats of this fungus being unleashed, the Sugar Bowl can be found in the very center of heated debate, sought after by both factions of the V.F.D. Rumors speculate that the Sugar Bowl may contain powerful secrets, blackmail-worthy knowledge, and perhaps something far worse. Despite its contents, the Sugar Bowl is coveted by all, but for different reasons—some seek power, others justice, while some simply wish to cause trouble. Only one thing is clear: every single person has a motive for stealing the Sugar Bowl—not just for its contents, but for the immense power and control it represents. As delegates, it is your moral obligation to locate the culprit of the Sugar Bowl's disappearance, for if it falls into the wrong hands, it could be the end of civilization as we know it.

GUIDING QUESTIONS

- 1. What are some strategies to use to uncover the thief of the Sugar Bowl? How will you work together to devise a plan to find the culprit?
- 2. What possible secrets or information might be hidden in the Sugar Bowl?
- 3. What should be done with the Sugar Bowl, if and when found? Can any one delegate or faction truly be entrusted with it?
- 4. What systems of protections can be put into place to ensure the Sugar Bowl never goes missing again?

Below is a timeline of traces left behind by the thief of the missing Sugar Bowl. Use these clues to uncover the thief and their motives.



TOPIC #3: V.F.D. - REUNITE OR COLLAPSE?

Once a noble organization committed to the power of knowledge, education and the prevention of fires, the Volunteer Fire Department is now in shambles. The original organization was torn apart by shocking betrayal, damaging secrets and differing ideologies. The group that once held the world's mysteries in its library is now nothing but a pile of ashes. Former allies question each other's longstanding loyalties and new members have trouble trusting and gaining the trust of others. As mysterious fires of feuds continue to burn and coded messages remain unanswered, a decision must be made: Should the V.F.D. reunite under a single vision, or is its collapse inevitable?

It is crucial for delegates to decode encrypted documents whilst navigating shifting alliances and hidden motivations—while perhaps harbouring a few secrets of their own. By the end of the discussion, a single leader must be appointed as the new head of the V.F.D., should reunification be agreed upon. Though beware, if reunification is not the verdict, there runs a risk of the organization's deep secrets and past crimes being revealed to the public. With each passing minute, danger lurks right around the corner and the organization's survival is at stake. Don't forget, your choices will shape the future of the V.F.D.—if there is to be a future at all.

GUIDING QUESTIONS

- 1. With past grudges still in the present, will members of the V.F.D. be able to get over those wounds and reunite? What are some ways you can reconcile and make amends with other members of the V.F.D.?
- 2. Who can you trust in a world built on codes and secrets? How can you determine ways to identify trustworthy alliances?
- 3. Should the organization's original policies still be preserved or is it time for a new era? What new policies should be implemented to prevent the schism from happening again?
- 4. What sacrifices are to be made should the V.F.D. reunite?





Quigley Quagmire








